Water System Improvements

The Village of Brimfield is constructing water system improvements to provide more reliable service to the Village. New water mains will be installed on Calhoun St. from Galena Ave. to Jackson St., on Jackson St. from Calhoun St. to the alley between Van Buren and E. Knoxville, on Jackson St. from Brimfield St. to Illinois St., and on Illinois St. from Jackson St. to Galena Ave. The improvements also include installation of a water storage tank at the treatment plant.

The project is being financed by the Public Water Supply Loan Program. This program is administered by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency, which receives a portion of its money to fund these types of projects from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency.

Once complete, this project will improve the integrity and reliability of the water system for the residents and businesses in the Village of Brimfield by replacing small and outdated water lines, by connecting water main loops, and by providing backup storage facilities during maintenance activities.

The Public Water Supply Loan Program operates in each state to provide communities the resources necessary to build, maintain, and improve the infrastructure that protects one of our most valuable resources: our water.
